HARD FOR SNOW PACKED POPU-LATED AREAS EAST OF "THE RIV-ER" TO BELIEVE THAT MANY PARTS OF THE SOUTHWEST, GREAT PLAIN\* **9WESTERN CORNBELT ARE SHORT** OF MOISTURE THIS WINTER AND A GOOD SNOW WOULD BE BENEFI-CIAL. FARMERS KEEP MOVING A SMALL VOLUME OF BEANS AND CORN TO MARKET AT CURRENT RELATIVELY HIGH PRICES, BUT HOLDING SOME BACK FOR USUAL JULY OR AUGUST DROUGHT NEWS THAT PUSHES THE MARKET UP. JULY CORN ON THE BOARD IS OVER 3.00 AND SOYBEANS 6.90. THE PRICE




