Skiers To Be Served Hot Chocolate

SOMERSET (Somerset Co.) — Pennsylvania's dairy farmers are taking the wintery treat, hot chocolate to Seven Springs Ski Resort to emphasize that only milk makes this beverage a delight. The special promotion will be held on Sunday, March

6, at the resort, just outside of Somerset. It is jointly sponsored by Mid East United Dairy Industry Association/F.O. 36 Advertising Agency and the Pennsylvania Dairy Promotion Program. "We want to give samples of real hot chocolate to skiers to let them know how important it is to make hot chocolate with milk," says Nadine Houck, Promotions Specialist with Pennsylvania Dairy. "This is a great event for dairy farmers because they can encourage incremental increases in milk consumption. Consumers will leave knowing that they should only use milk to make hot chocolate."

Hot chocolate samples will be distributed on a first-come, first-served basis from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. In addition, the first 2,000 skiers at the resort will receive a free thermomug to make their own hot chocolate for the next trip down the slopes.

"This is the perfect opportunity for Pennsylvania skiers to taste the real thing," adds Houck. "We'll be on hand at the event to show them just how easy it is to make hot chocolate with milk. I'm sure they'll agree that the small amount of effort is worth the results."

The event is part of dairy promotion programming in Pennsylvania, all designed to promote the state's milk and dairy products. Pennsylvania's dairy industry is the number one agricultural industry and a significant contributor to the state's economy.

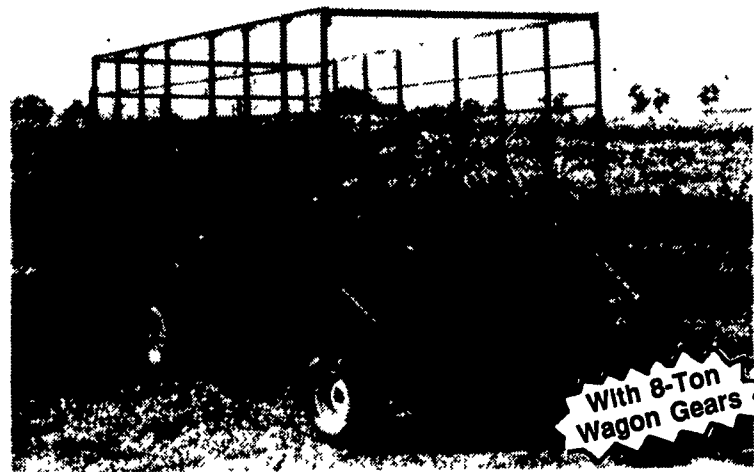
