

New Regulations Improve Labeling For Liming Materials

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Agriculture Secretary Boyd E. Wolff has announced the creation of new regulations dealing with agricultural liming materials. The regulations require manufacturers to provide more information about the materials.

"These regulations will benefit both the producers of liming materials and consumers," Wolff said. "Additional products will be made available for agricultural use, and consumers will be assured of getting the type of materials that they need."

Under the new regulations, liming materials sold in Pennsylvania must include labels stating the name and principal office address of the manufacturer or distributor, the brand or trade name of the material, the type and classification of liming material, minimal calcium carbonate equivalent (CCE), minimum effective neutralizing value (ENV), maximum moisture, percentage of total calcium and magnesium, and percentage passing through U.S. Standard mesh sieves.

The new regulations have been developed in response to requests from agribusinesses who sought

uniformity in labeling liming materials for use in different stages. Representatives of industry, government, and land grant colleges from Pennsylvania, New York, Ohio, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, and West Virginia held a series of meetings to develop uniform labeling requirements for agricultural liming materials which would be applicable in all of those states. Pennsylvania, a leader in the production and sale of agricultural liming materials, is ahead of the other participating states in efforts to implement the proposed standards.

Editor Wins Journalism Award

Everett Newswanger, managing editor, *Lancaster Farming*, was awarded the 1994 Northeast Farm Communicator Association Award for excellence for the best photojournalism farm story at the association's winter meeting in Manchester, New Hampshire, earlier this month. The Communicator Association is a group of professional agricultural journalists, broadcasters, and public relations persons from the Northeast part of the U.S.

The winning story featured the bulk milk tank truck driver who left his small son waiting at home for his daddy to return from days of non-stop efforts to get the milk from farm to plant in the blizzard snows of 1993.

Newswanger is the 1993 Honorary County Agent named by the Pennsylvania Agricultural County Agents Association at their annual meeting in State College in November. More recently the Pennsylvania Young Farmers Associ-

prior-converted croplands and the permit exemption for normal farming practices should also be spelled out in law.

The last time the federal government operated on a balanced budget was 25 years ago. Farm Bureau supports passage of a balanced budget constitutional amendment to bring discipline to runaway federal spending. The amendment would require that federal outlays be in balance with federal revenues unless three-fifths of the entire membership of the House and Senate vote for higher spending.

In addition to visiting their con-

gressmen, farmers attending PA Farm Bureau's Washington Tour will hear addresses from Congressman Rick Santorum (R-18th Dist.) and PFB president Keith Eckel. The farmers will be updated on the activities of the U.S. House Agriculture Committee by Rep. Tim Holden (D-6th Dist.), Pennsylvania's only congressman on the committee.

The Pennsylvania Farm Bureau is a voluntary, general farm organization which represents 23,542 farm families in 54 county units. It is affiliated with the nation's largest general farm organization, the 4.2-million member American Farm Bureau Federation.
