DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT AND CORN PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY LOWER, WEDNESDAY, PRESSURED BY LACK OF GOOD EXPORT DEMAND AND PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD. SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB ON SPILLOVER STRENGTH FROM TUESDAY AND LIGHT EXPORT SUPPORT. WHEAT 1 TO 15 CENTS LOWER EXCEPT PORTLAND 4 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 2 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 2 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER. FOREIGN SALES CONTINUE LOW FOR WHEAT THIS WEEK. RECENT SNOWFALL IN WINTER WHEAT AREAS ADDED BENEFICIAL PROTECTION TO CROP ALSO WEIGHED ON WHEAT PRICES. LIGHT EXPORT SALES OF WHITE WHEAT, LIMITED PRICE DECLINES CORN PRICES FOLLOWED WHEAT LOWER AS BUYERS BECAME SELL-ERS. THE LACK OF NEW EXPORT DEMAND THIS WEEK ADDED PRES-SURE TO CORN PRICES. RECENT ADVANCES WERE EXTENDED IN SOYBEAN PITS TODAY STRENGTH-ENED BY A DECENT WEEKLY EXPORT INSPECTION REPORT YES-TERDAY AND TAIWAN'S PURCH-ASE. INDICATIONS CHINA TO PURCHASE 60,000 TONNES U.S. SOY-BEANS WAS ALSO A PLUS FACTOR.


