DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES TURNED STRONGER, WEDNESDAY, BOOSTED BY IMPROVED EXPORT DEMAND AND IDEAS WHEAT IS CONSIDERED OVERSOLD. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES FELL SLIGHTLY PRESSURED BY INCREASED TRADE TENSIONS BETWEEN JAPAN AND THE U.S. AND LACK OF FRESH EXPORT NEWS. WHEAT 2 TO 6 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 3 TO 5 CENTS LOWER. SOR- GHUM 3 TO 7 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 1 TO 4 CENTS LOWER. EXPORT WHEAT SALES HAVE BEEN SLOW ALL WEEK BUT SOME INTERESTS TODAY FIRMED PRICES. DRY CONDITIONS REMAIN IN WEST PLAINS WHEAT AREAS ALSO SUPPORTED PRICES. TRADERS BELIEVE WHEAT MARK-ETS ARE REACHING THE OVERSOLD LEVEL. WEAKER CORN AND BEAN PRICES DUE TO LACK OF EXPORT DEMAND AND A SHARP DROP IN THE U.S. STOCK MARKET TODAY. TENSIONS BETWEEN U.S. AND JAPAN DUE TO THREATS OF U.S. TRADE SANCTIONS AGAINS JAPAN, PRESSURED PRICES. THIS COULD SEVERLY HURT EXPORT SALES TO ONE OF THE MOST RELIABLE U.S. GRAIN CUSTOMERS. SOYBEAN PRICES WERE ALSO EFFECTED BY DRIER WEATHER FORECAST FOR NORTHERN BRAZIL OVER THE NEXT WEEK ALLOWING HARVEST TO RESUME.




