OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Feeder steers and heifers steady to \$1.00 lower, with closing market approacing steady. Stocker cattle and calves \$1.00-\$3.00 higher. Trade active thruout day and night. Demand good for large supply of feeders off wheat; demand excellent for light supply of stockers and calves. Weigh condition average to gaunt. Quality of supply plain thru attractive. Cattle continue to perform very well on short wheat; flesh condition of feeders average to fleshy with bulk again on fleshy side. Stockers and calves in thin and hard condition. Rains Monday and Tuesday are forecasted to be followed by warm clear weather. This rain coupled with that of week ago brightens outlook for many Oklahoma wheat producers and cattle grazers. Cutter and boning Utility cows steady, fleshy cows \$1.00-\$3.00 lower. Slaughter bulls steady. Demand from packers mixed. Receipts this week 15,950; last week 13,450; last year 10,861. Supply consisted of 86 percent yearlings over 600 lbs.: 12 percent calves and yearlings under 600 lbs.; 2 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
