#### SEVENTH FROM THE SUN

n March 13/1781 William Herschel was making a routine telescopic survey of the sky when he made an important discovery. At first, he thought the disklike light he saw was a comet, so he carefully tracked its motion for some weeks. It was not until several months later, after a preliminary orbit was calculated, that he realized he had discovered a new planet. The name for this cosmic body occasioned much discussion (And still does among children!) Herschel proposed Geoguan Sidus in honor of England's George III Others suggested naming it after Herschell Finally, the tradition of naming planets after gods of Greek mythology was upheld. The newly found seventh planet was named after the



father of the Titans and grandfather of Jupiter Uranus Everything is good in its place.




