

Lebanon Holds 4-H Livestock Meeting

NORTH CORNWALL (Lebanon Co.) — The Lebanon County 4-H Livestock Club held its annual banquet Tuesday at the Lebanon Area Fairgrounds and named its outstanding members.

At least 200 people attended the event held for the first time in the large show barn facility of the fairgrounds convention center.

During the meeting, the achievements of members during the past year were reviewed, leaders were recognized for their efforts, and the club's outstanding members were named.

The outstanding senior member was Wendy Atkins, 14, who has been a member of the the 4-H Beef Club, Sheep Club, Swine Club and judging team. She has been involved in many projects and demonstrations and competitions and is also a member of Cedar Crest High School FFA, the school

band, Youth For Christ and its volleyball team, and is on the school's superior honor roll.

In cooperation with her brothers, she had projects in breeding hogs, and then on her own she did projects with market steer, breeding ram lamb, ewes, two market hogs for the county fair, a carcass hog, and entered hogs in the club roundup, the Southeastern Pa. Hog Derby, at Keystone International Livestock Exposition, and the Farm Show. She has also raised market and carcass lambs for competition.

She was seventh in judging at State Day, and participated in judging contests in York, the Lebanon-Lancaster contest, York Far, Lebanon Fair, in the Penn State University Block and Bridle competition, at Delaware Valley University, the Stockman's Contest, and at the Eastern States

Exposition in Massachusetts.

In addition she participated in numerous food and livestock commodity promotions, served as chairman of the club's cookie sales, has been involved in a number of club activities.

The outstanding junior member was Joseph Tice, 10, whose projects included market lamb, market hogs and breeding sheep. He participated in a number of contest locally, at Penn State, Delaware Valley College and in Lancaster and York, as well as being a member of the county junior livestock judging team. He also participated in the county fair, his club's Roundup and the state Farm Show.

His additional activities include serving as an acolyte at Millcreek Lutheran Church, playing baseball, soccer and basketball, and he is a member of Boy Scout Troop 47.

The Outstanding Rookie of the Year was Janine Winebark, 8, who showed the grand champion market hog of the 1994 state Farm Show.

Janine has also been involved in numerous commodity promotions, almost all the 4-H club activities, and she has raised market lambs and hogs and competed at the county fair, the Southeast Pa. Market Hog Derby, taking champion carcass, taking a first at the Maryland State Fair, two firsts at the Eastern National Livestock Exposition, placed in the KILE, and showed the grand champion crossbred hog at the 4-H Roundup, taking reserve grand champion overall, in addition to many other awards and achievements.

Her extra-curricular activities include sports and activities at the Richland Church of the Brethren.
