Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed and ranged close balance to available. Trading was reported at unchanged prices and the undertone was steady. Line run breasts were also irregularly distributed with some committed deliveries shorted while other processors offered product at current prices. Dark meat items were well cleared and the undertone was fully steady. Yellow wings improved over early week with prices trending unchanged to higher. White skin wings were tight.
