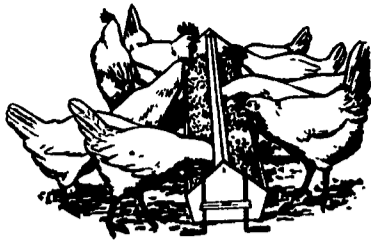

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds slowed and was generally no better than fair. Seller offerings varied, but were fully adequate to cover current inquiry. Live supplies were moderate; weights were mixed in a full range of light to heavy. Processing schedules were very heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 1 cent higher at 54 to 66 cents. Trade sentiment was steady. In the parts complex, supplies were at least adequate on all items.

Trucklot buying interest was irregular and ranged light to fair but slower than typical Wednesday trading. Supplies of boneless skinless breasts were irregularly distributed and ranged close balance to available. Trading was reported at unchanged prices and the undertone was steady. Line run breasts were also irregularly distributed with some committed deliveries shorted while other processors offered product at current prices. Dark meat items were well cleared and the undertone was fully steady. Yellow wings improved over early week with prices trending unchanged to higher. White skin wings were tight.

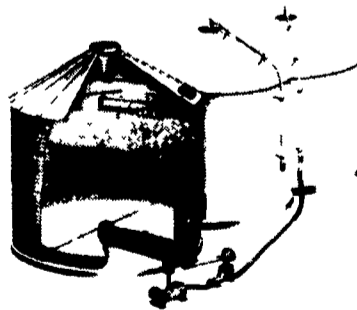
