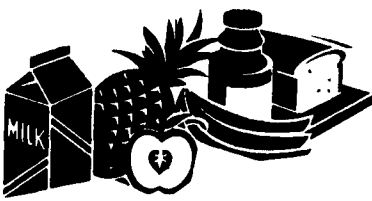

Live hen offerings were about adequate for the light to moderate demand, and the undertone was mostly steady.
