harvest size, three-year average, first went to Burd W. Schantz, Alburts, with a 200.8 bushels/acre average using Pioneer 3358, 3245, and 3352;

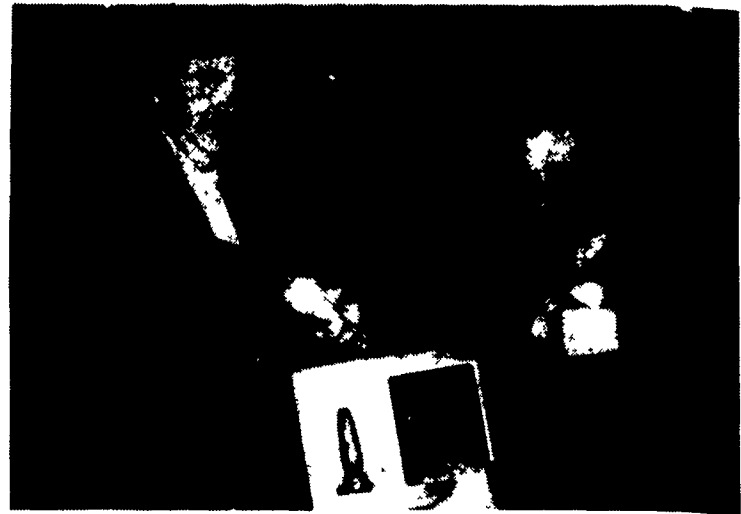
second to Kenneth L. Schlegel, Fleetwood, with a 184.9 bushels/acre average using Pioneer 3343 and 3293; and third to Sandy Ridge Farms, Shipperville, with an average

of 173.2 bushels/acre using Pioneer 3527, 3394, and 3727.

In the 1993 shelled grain class, regular harvest size, first went to Herman Manbeck, Womelsdorf, with a 207.7 bushels/acre yield using Pioneer 3293; second to Matthew Maximuck, Doylestown, for a yield of 198.8 bushels/acre using DeKalb 623; and third to Lloyd Zook, Oley, with a 190.1 bushels/acre yield using Pioneer 3292.

In the 3 acre+ harvest size, first went to Norman Jodikinos, Clinton, for a yield of 197.7 bushels/acre yield using Pioneer 3245; second to Lee Hitz, Annville, with a yield of 185.4 bushels/acre using Pioneer 3394; and third to Stuart Ramm, Lock Haven, for a yield of 184 bushels/acre using Doebler's 62 XP.

In the ear corn class, hand harvest size, first went to David W. Schantz, Alburts, for a yield of 205.9 bushels/acre

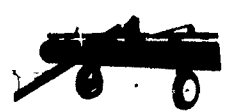
