Storage Tank Meeting Rescheduled

REHRERSBURG (Berks Co.) — State Rep. Sheila Miller, R-Berks County, has rescheduled a public meeting for farmers concerning the DER underground storage tank act and its impact on their operations.

Due to adverse weather conditions, the meeting originally scheduled for March 3 had to be cancelled. The new meeting is to be March 31, at 7 p.m. in the Bethel Community Center.

The Storage Tank and Spill Prevention Act was signed into law in 1989 (Act 32). This law, and the regulations which were adopted as a result of this statute (25 Pa. Code), have created much concern and raised many questions. Section 705 of the regulations deals with the powers and duties of the Underground Storage Tank Indemnificaton Fund, and fees that are associated with the fund.

Ron Gallagher, a representative from the Insurance Department Indemnification Fund board will be on hand to give explanations and answer questions regarding the program.

"Many farmers have been in contact with me since the beginning of the year," said Miller. "I am hoping this meeting will be able to answer many questions and help to identify problem areas in the law and regulations which severely affect agriculture. Once this information is gathered, I will be better able to go to Harrisburg and see what, if anything, can be done to correct this financial drain." panel of three judges will select an Outstanding Young Cooperator couple and four runners-up.

The Days milk in a tie stall barn and keep the cows in a free-stall barn with floating separaters and wood shavings.

They have eight Excellent and a number of Very Good cows which displayed tall stature, good feet and legs and mammaries.

They feed a TMR via a conveyor system to the feed bunk in the free stall barn. They previously had a problem with displaced abomasums (DA's), but have apparently solved the problem by lining the bottom of the feed bunk with hay before filling with TMR. Since adopting that practice, they haven't had any more incidence of DAs. The Days breed for production and type, and their children also get to select the sires for their own cattle. The have a BAA of 108.

At the Tidy-Brook Farm in Greencastle, tour participants got the chance to see eight daughters of the highest indexing cow for protein in the Holstein breed.

On the January Active List, four of the top five cows for PTA protein carried the Tidy-Brook prefix.

One was a Cleitus daughter, another a Blackstar, one Southwind, and the rest out of Emprise Bell Elton, a BLAD carrier.

Two of the top cows for protein are Elton daugthers and are on the farm.



The recessive genetic condition which causes the BLAD disease is a concern for them with selling bulls, but Alan said it is still worth it to have the contracts.

So far, he said they have marketed more than 140 embryoes oversees. He said Japanese buyers had recently been to the farm to look over his cattle.

The 85-cow herd is managed for milk production, but owners Mark and Alan Meyers, said the concentrate mostly on merchandising.

Alan explained how he ended up with Tidy-Brook Sally Ned Boy. He said he was actually trying to get some semen from Blackstar and ended up with Ned Boy, although, at the time, Ned Boy didn't have much of a proof and no information was out on his daughters.

On her first lactation she made 26,650 pounds of milk, 892 pounds fat and 878 pounds of protein.

As a 3-year-old, she made 37,350 pounds of milk, 1,214 pounds of fat and 1.214 pounds of protein in 305 days, ranking second in the state for registered Holsteins for protein production. When the lactation was extended to 365 days, she came in with the third highest amount of protein with 1,349 pounds, from 41,455 pounds of milk, and 1,379 pounds of fat.

All the bulls go to A.I., with contracts with most U.S. studs and two bulls going to Japan, according to the Meyers. Any bulls that don't get sold into A.I. go locally for on-farm use.
