that there will be "megadaeries" with 1,000 to 5,000 cows. He believes that the family farm will have 200 to 600 head of cows, and that small family farms with 60 to 120 cows can remain in business only if they are well managed, with low debt.

Along with continued improvement in dairy stock, there will be a continuing move toward maximum pasturing. This will lessen labor needs, and with the cows doing the harvesting the largest economy can be achieved.

Muller described conditions in New Zealand, where year-around pasturing is possible, and showed that maximum production did not always maximize profits. But the New Zealand system uses a great deal less labor, uses less feed except from pastures, and has lower mastitis than U.S. dairying. Some of their practices might be useful here.

The day's program ended with the drawing of the door prizes provided by the exhibitors. These ranged from hats to motor oil to baler twine and a \$50 gift certificate. The big prize for the day, however, was a calf sired by Madawaska Aerostar and born on Jan. 4. The dam is a Plushanski Buckeye daughter. The calf was won by Tom Champluluvier.

Optional programs were held concurrently with the main program. Topics covered were herd evaluation, with DHIA representative Pat Toretti in charge, and computerized farm financial packages, presented by Lehan Power, multicounty agent. Mark Madden, Penn State extension, discussed ways of controlling perennial weeds.

Before, during, and after the formal programs, the large crowd of farmers had the opportunity to visit with exhibitors and to learn of any materials which would help them in their operations.

February Milk Down

HARRISBURG (Dauphin Co.) — Milk production in Pennsylvania during February totaled 789 million pounds, 1 percent below last year's production, according to the Pennsylvania Agricultural Statistics Service (PASS).

The number of milk cows in the state during the month averaged 647,000 head, down 3,000 from January, and 4,000 fewer than February 1993.

Production per cow averaged 1,220 pounds in February, 100 pounds less than January's pro-

duction per cow of 1,320 pounds, and unchanged from February 1993.

Milk production in the 21 states surveyed during February totaled 9.79 billion pounds, down 1 percent compared to production during February 1993.

The number of milk cows averaged 8.02 million head, down 175,000 head from a year earlier, and production per cow averaged 1,221 pounds, 12 pounds more than February of last year.
