OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Feeder steers steady to \$2.00 lower with declines on those over 800 lbs.. Feeder heifers \$1.00-\$2.00 lower. Demand moderate to good for feeder cattle. This week should be the last major movement off wheat in Oklahoma until May 1st. Stocker cattle generally steady with continued very good demand. Quality of supply continued average thru attractive. Flesh condition of feeders not as attractive as last week, few slightly thin but mainly average thru moderately fleshy. Stocker condition thin to average, many thin. Weigh conditions gaunt to full with majority in average fill. Slaughter cows \$1.00-\$2.00 lower. Slaughter bulls \$1.00 lower. Packer demand light to moderate. Receipts this

week 16,850; last week 12,469; last year 10,658. Supply consisted of 72 percent yearlings over 600 lbs.; 25 percent calves and stockers under 600 lbs.; 3 percent cows and bulls.
