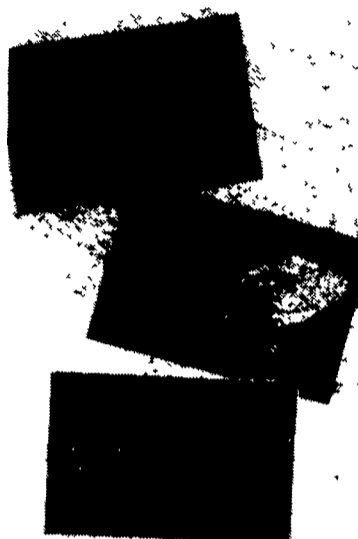
The Uniform line fits all Category I and II tractors and includes the CM 210 mower, the CW 440 tedder, and the CR 330 rotary rake.
