Flesh condition of feeders average to moderately fleshy; stocker flesh slightly thin thru very thin. Heavy stockers not as plentiful as last few weeks. Weigh conditions average to full, few gaunt. Quality plain to average, modest end attractive and this well below past weeks. Slaughter cows and bulls steady to \$1.00 lower. 290 Cows and bulls sold. Receipts this week 9,200; last week 7,853; last year 6,939. Supply consisted of 75 percent yearlings over 600 lbs.; 22 percent calves and stockers under 600 lbs.; 3 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
