 DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES FINISHED MIXED, WEDNESDAY, SUPPORTED BY EXPORT DEMAND AND OPTIMISM FOR UPCOMING BUSINESS WITH CHINA. HOWEVER, WET CONDITIONS IN WINTER WHEAT AREAS LIMITED GAINS. CORN PRICES WERE LITTLE CHANGED. SOYBEAN PRICES ARE SLIGHTLY HIGHER WITH FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD AND PROMISING EXPORT OUTLOOK MAJOR FACTORS. WHEAT MIXED. CORN MIXED. SORGHUM 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS UNCHANGED TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. RECENT RAINS IN CENTRAL PLAINS ARE BENEFICIAL TO WHEAT GROWTH BUT HAMPERING SPRING WHEAT PLANTING. EXPORT SALES HAVE BEEN GOOD THIS WEEK AND IDEAS CHINA MAY STILL WANT U.S. WHEAT, SUPPORTED PRICES. INDICATIONS THAT CHINA MAY BE IN THE MARKET FOR U.S. CORN, UNDERPINNED CORN PRICES. TUESDAY'S USDA STOCKS REPORT FORECAST 93/94 ENDING CORN STOCKS AT 827 WHICH WAS 25 MILLION BUSHELS HIGHER THAN MARCH ESTIMATE BUT LOWER THAN TRADE EXPECTATIONS. FIELDWORK WAS DELAYED DUE TO RAINY MIDWEST AREAS THIS WEEK BUT SOME DRYNESS IS FORECAST FOR THE LATTER PART OF THE WEEK. SOYBEAN PRICES INCHED SLIGHTLY HIGHER DUE TO IMPROVED EXPORT INTERESTS

AND FUND BUYING ON THE BOARD. CONTINUED DELAYS IN BRAZILIAN HARVEST ALSO SUPPORTED BEAN PRICES.


