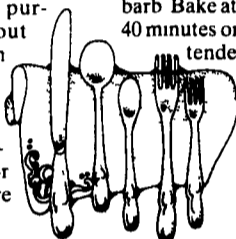

RHUBARB CRISP

- 4 cups diced rhubarb
- 1/2 cup white sugar
- 1 cup flour
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 cup butter

Mix together rhubarb and white sugar and place in greased 9x9-inch pan. Combine remaining ingredients and mix well until crumbly, sprinkle over rhubarb. Bake at 350° F for about 40 minutes or until rhubarb is tender and topping is golden brown. Serve warm with ice cream. Makes 6 servings.
