At Stan El, Janelle helps extensively with the computer which is used for feeding and breeding purposes and keeps track of the amount of feed consumed by each cow daily. It tells the family how much butterfat and protein each cow is producing. The Koontz family also has a state-of-the-art milking system which allows them to milk 85 cows in 1½ hours.

Leading a well rounded life, Janelle is a cheerleader, on the student council, in chorus, the science olympiad, envir-o-thon, and teen club. She is also active in the Friendly Moo-Moo's 4-H Club.


Runners up were Emily Dietrich, a junior at Shippensburg High School, and Angelina M. Poligardo, a senior at Meyersdale.
