## Growers To Meet Near Kutztown

KUTZTOWN (Berks Co.) — A twilight growers' meeting will be held here at the John Brubaker farm on May 4 at 6 p.m.

Topics covered will include cover crops, relay cropping, composting, and no-till soybeans without herbicide.

Since 1991, Brubaker has participated in a unique project with the Rodale Institute Research Center (RIRC) known as the Whole Farm Management Study. Through this study Brubaker and RIRC staff haye looked at the effect that implementing low-input practices has on the whole farm, and at how well new practices work on a real farm.

Brubaker implements low-input farming practices on a portion of his farm, allowing researchers to monitor the effectiveness of those practices on a farm scale.

Researchers also look at Brubaker's beef feedlot to get a picture of how the livestock operation affects crop production. The growers' meeting will focus on several practices used on this study site.

One topic will be the use of hairy vetch as a cover crop. Brubaker and RIRC staff will discuss benefits and management of this cover crop and how this crop fits in Brubaker's crop rotation. A demonstration of no-till corn in this cover crop will occur.

Relay cropping is a soybean

production system incorporating soybeans and small grains which Brubaker has successfully used in the past. He will demonstrate that system as a part of this meeting and explain management of that system.

Brubaker and RIRC staff will discuss the farm's use of composting as a manure handling system

# Moisture, Temperature Keys

GOLDEN VALLEY, Minn. — Under ideal conditions, the earliest corn will emerge from the ground is five to six days after planting, said Jim Graeber, Northrup King Co., Illinois agronomist.

However, Graeber noted that corn is seldom planted under optimal conditions, so growers need to adjust planting depth accordingly.

Adequate moisture and temperature levels are vital to seed germination and plant emergence, Graeber said. Because heat is usually the limiting factor early in the season, shallow planting is best. Even then, it might take as long
