 DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY GOOD EXPORT DEMAND SUPPORTED WHEAT PRICES; CORN PRICES ARE HIGHER FROM RAINY WEATHER OUTLOOK AND IDEAS THE MARKET HAD BECOME OVERSOLD; SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB ON STRONG OIL MARKETS AND WEATHER CONCERNS. WHEAT 2 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 2 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 5 TO 10 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT PRICES TURNED HIGHER ON ACTIVE U.S. WHEAT EXPORT BUSINESS WITH JAPAN IN THE MARKET TODAY. DESPITE RECENT FAVORABLE GROWING WEATHER SOME WHEAT AREAS REMAIN DRY. CORN PLANTING PROGRESS MAY BE DELAYED AS MOISTURE IS FORECAST FOR MIDWEST AREAS OVER THE NEXT FEW DAYS. PROFIT TAKING ON THE BOARD DUE TO OVERSOLD CONDITIONS ALSO ADDED SUPPORT TO CORN PRICES. SPILLOVER STRENGTH FROM WHEAT AND BEAN PRICES A FACTOR IN PRICE UPTURNS. STRENGTH IN OIL PRICES CONTINUED TO DRIVE SOYBEAN PRICES HIGHER. EXPORT SOYBEAN ORDERS HAVE BEEN GOOD THIS WEEK. WET WEATHER MOVING INTO MIDWEST AREAS IMPLY FIELDWORK DELAYS.

 OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last week: Feeder steers and heifers ranged from \$1.00-\$3.00 lower, mostly \$2.00 down. Stocker steers steady to \$1.00 lower; stocker heifer steady. Trade moderately active at the lower levels. Demand moderate. Quality of supply plain thru attractive, mostly average. However, most feeders in heavy May flesh and considered to be poor gainers in the feedlot. Bulk supply feeder cattle off graze-out wheat. Cattle coming off earlier this year as they have done extremely well on strong wheat. Weigh-ups gaunt thru moderately full, mostly average. Slaughter cows steady to \$.50 lower. Slaughter bulls steady. Packer demand moderate to good. Total of 561 cows sold. Receipts this week 16,000; last week 10,903; last year 8,914. Supply consisted of 85 percent yearlings over 600 lbs.; 11 percent stockers and calves under 600 lbs.; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.
