## Pennfield To Donate Chicken For Make-A-Wish Fund Raiser

The craft show, with more than 35 vendors will begin at 10 a.m. in the parking

The chicken barbecue will feature a Pennfield chicken quarter and dinner. Pennfield is once again donating 2,500 chicken quarters for the barbecue. The \$3 dinner will be available starting at 10:30 a.m. Takeouts will be available. Tickets are available in advance, by calling the Make-A-Wish office at (717) 392-3840. Advance ticket buyers are eligible for a drawing for a 1994 Make-A-Wish Toy Winross truck.

The premier event of the day, the convoy to Ephrata and back, will start at 1 p.m. Wish Children and their siblings will be riding along with the trucks. As space warrants, children from the community will also have the opportunity to ride in the trucks. More than 250 trucks and fire trucks are

expected to join in the 30-mile ride. The convoy will go to Brownstown, north on Rt. 272, to Rt. 322, east through Ephrata, then to Rt. 222 south, returning to the Burle lot.

QUESTION — Robin O'Brien, Reading, would like to know some economical cleaning solutions to be used on everything from cleaning wooden floors to fiberglass tubs.




