DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY

GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES STEADY TO HIGHER TUESDAY. SOYBEAN PRICE GAINS TOOK A BREATH TODAY, WITH WHEAT AND CORN IN THE LIMELIGHT. WHEAT 2 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER, WITH SOME OF THE NORTHERN AREAS 5-10 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 2-4 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS FRATIONALLY HIGHER AND LOWER.

GOOD WHEAT EXPORT ORDERS LAST WEEK AND EARLY THIS WEEK A FACTOR IN HIGHER PRICES. SNOW AND COLD TEMPERATURES MOVING OUT OF THE NORTHWEST COULD DAMAGE SOME WHEAT. FOR THE MOST PART NEW CROP WHEAT LOOKING VERY GOOD, FEW PLACES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT NEEDS MOISTURE AND SUFFERED SOME WIND DAMAGE.

SHOWERS ACROSS THE CORNBELT HIGHLY SCATTERED AND CORN PLANTERS CONTINUED TO ROLL, BUT PRICES HIGHER TODAY. CORN PLANTING WELL ABOVE NORMAL FOR THIS TIME OF THE YEAR. SNOW AND COLD TEMPERATURES DIPPING DOWN INTO THE NORTHERN SECTION OF THE WESTERN CORNBELT, EXPECTED TO SLOW PLANTING PROGRESS. STILL PLENTY OF TIME TO PLANT AND REPLANT CORN, NOT EVEN MAY YET.

SOYBEANS RATHER QUIET TODAY, AFTER MONDAY'S SHARP ADVANCE. BULLS STILL LOOKING AT TIGHT STOCKS AND GOOD DEMAND FOR SOYBEAN. OTHER OILSEED PRICES SHOWING HIGHER TRENDS. RECORD SETTING EARLY SEEDINGS OF CORN AND COTTON EXPECTED TO TAKE WHAT WOULD

NORMALLY BE SOME SOYBEAN ACRES.

EXPORT NEWS: THE U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED A BID TO SELL 910 TONNES OF SUNOIL TO MEXICO UNDER THE SUNFLOWERSEED OIL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; SHIPMENT IS SCHEDULED FOR MAY 1-31. THE U.S.D.A. ACCEPTED BIDS TO SELL 1,000 TONNES OF COTTONSEED OIL TO EL SALVADOR UNDER THE COTTONSEED OILS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM; SHIPMENT IS SCHEDULED FOR AUGUST 15-SEPTEMBER 15.
