GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES STEADY TO HIGHER TUESDAY, SOY-BEAN PRICE GAINS TOOK A BREATHER TODAY, WITH WHEAT AND CORN IN THE LIMELIGHT. WHEAT 2 TO 4 CENTS HIGHER, WITH SOME OF THE NORTHERN AREAS 5-10 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 1 TO 3 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 2-4 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS FRAC-TIONALLY HIGHER AND LOWER.

GOOD WHEAT EXPORT ORDERS LAST WEEK AND EARLY THIS WEEK A FACTOR IN HIGHER PRICES. SNOW AND COLD TEMPERATURES MOV-ING OUT OF THE NORTHWEST COULD DAMAGE SOME WHEAT. FOR THE MOST PART NEW CROP WHEAT LOOKING VERY GOOD, FEW PLACES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT NEEDS MOISTURE AND SUFFERED SOME WIND DAMAGE.

SHOWERS ACROSS THE CORN-BELT HIGHLY SCATTERED AND CORN PLANTERS CONTINUED TO ROLL, BUT PRICES HIGHER TODAY. CORN PLANTING WELL ABOVE NORMAL FOR THIS TIME OF THE YEAR. SNOW AND COLD TEMPERA-TURES DIPPING DOWN INTO THE NORTHER SECTION OF THE WEST-ERN CORNBELT, EXPECTED TO SLOW PLANTING PROGRESS. STILL PLENTY OF TIME TO PLANT AND REPLANT CORN, NOT EVEN MAY YET.

SOYBEANS RATHER QUIET TODAY, AFTER MONDAY'S SHARP ADVANCE. BULLS STILL LOOKING AT TIGHT STOCKS AND GOOD DEMAND FOR SOYOIL. OTHER OIL-SEED PRICES SHOWING HIGHER TRENDS. RECORD SETTING EARLY SEEDINGS OF CORN AND COTTON EXPECTED TO TAKE WHAT WOULD

NORMALLY BE SOME SOYBEAN ACRES.




