York Ag Land Preserve Board At Work

YORK (York Co.) — The York County Ag Land Preservation Board, appointed in June 1989 by the York County Board of Commissioners, began the task to create and implement the York County Conservation Easement Program. Since its review and approval by the PA Ag Land Preservation Board in August 1990, the program has received and evaluated 135 applications covering approximately 22,364 acres in 21 townships.

By the end of December 1993, the York County Ag Land Preserve Board had preserved 21 farms, in 10 townships, totaling 6,056 acres. Another 173-acre farm is awaiting State Board approval. York County currently

ranks second in the state for acres of farm land preserved.

During the January 1994 application cycle, the Ag Preserve Board Office received a total of 46 applications from 18 townships. Of those, six high scoring applications, covering 1,392 acres in eight townships, were selected for preservation process and will be submitted to the State Ag Land Preservation Board this fall for approval for preservation.

Statewide, 32 of PA's 67 counties have an approved conservation easement program. The Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Farmland Protection has approved the easement purchases on 431 farms covering 54,388 acres as of March 1994.

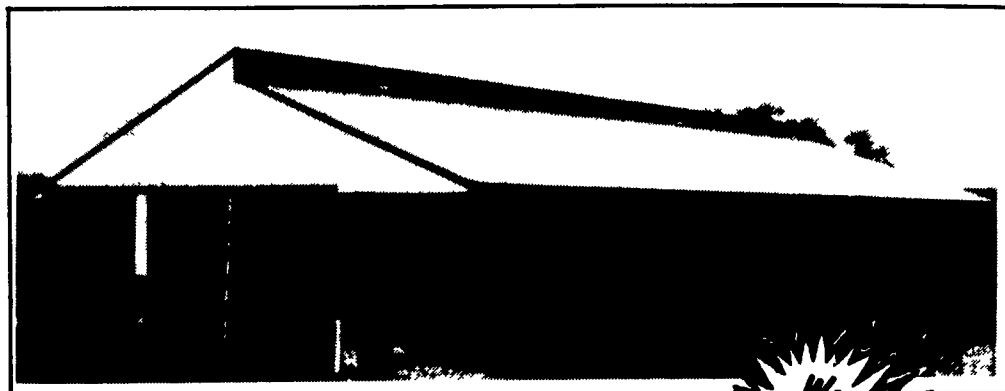

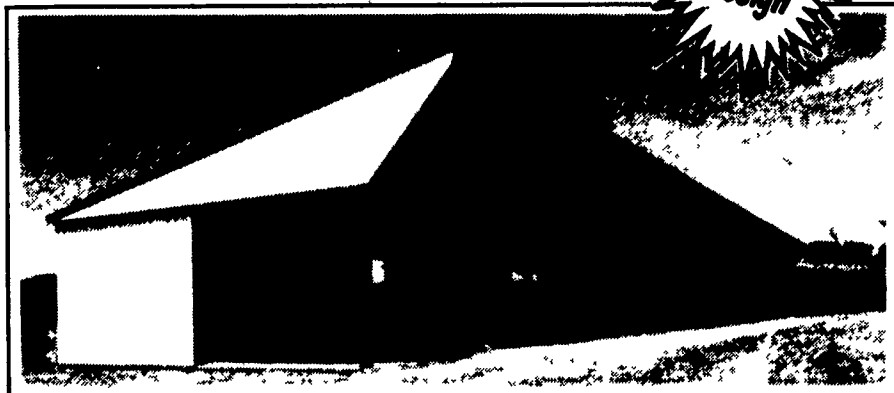
