Live supplies remained moderate to heavy; weights were desirable to slightly heavier than desired. Less than trucklot asking prices were 1 cent higher at 57 to 69 cents. Trade sentiment was fully steady to higher. In the parts complex, breast items were in short supply. Leg quarters were generally no more than adequate. Wings were adequate to fully adequate and were moving in closer balance with demand.
