COLLEGE PARK, Md. — Awards were presented recently to. 10 students and faculty members at the University of Maryland at College Park during the College of Agriculture Alumni Chapter's 27th annual reunion and awards banquet in Columbia.

The following UMCP College of Agriculture faculty "Excellence" awards were presented:

• Instruction. Leon H. Slaughter, assistant professor of agronomy, has been a UMCP faculty member since 1988. Dr. Slaughter chairs the crop science curriculum committee, and he is a mentor to minority students at UMCP and elsewhere.

• Research. J. Scott Angle, professor of agronomy, has been a UMCP faculty member since 1981. On Feb. 21, Dr. Angle became acting associate director of the Maryland Agricultural Experiment Station on an interim basis. Angle is recognized internationally as a leader in soil microbiology.

• Extension. Dr. Douglas W. Lipton, assistant professor of agricultural and resource economics, has been a marine economics specialist for the cooperative extension service since 1988. Lipton is coordinator of the CES Sea Grant program and executive director of the Mid-Atlantic Regional Marine Research Program.

Dr. Paul H. Mazzochi, dean of

the College of Life Sciences at UMCP, was named an honorary member of the College of Agriculture Alumni Chapter. Mazzochi served as acting dean of the College of Agriculture, 1989-1993.

W. David Thompson of Street, a Harford County nurseryman, was honored for Meritorious Service to Agriculture. Thompson earned a bachelor's degree in horticulture at UMCP in 1975. He spearheaded efforts to gain legislative approval for the new plant sciences building now under construction on the College Park campus.

• Laurie Zimmerman, an agricultural resource economics senior from Frederick, and Scott Page, a prebusiness ag economics junior from Binghamton, N.Y., were chosen as the College of Agriculture Alumni Scholarship recipients.

Trocheck, a landscape architecture major from Millersville, Pa., both graduating seniors, were each recognized for their service as an agriculture student ambassador.
