**FOLLOW YOUR MUSE**

Here's a bit of museum lore for International Museum Day. May 18 *Museum* is Latin, "place for learned occupation." and comes from the Greek *mouseion*, "place of the Muses." The first waxworks museum came from England in 1749 and included figures of King George II and Frederick, Prince of Wales, dressed in royal splendor. America's first public museum was organized by the Charleston (South Carolina) Library Society in 1773. Today, there's more to museums than wax figures and oil paintings.

Consider these: The Vent Haven Ventriquoism Museum, Fort Mitchell, Ky.; the Liberace Museum, Las Vegas, Nev.; or The Grand Guitar, Bristol, Tenn. (shaped like a guitar!) Museums truly have "something for everyone."

**TIP OF THE WEEK**

Prevent shirt sleeves from tangling in the laundry: button front of shirt and button cuffs to the front.

**EARTHWISE**

Caustic drain cleaners may work wonders on your clogged drain, but they wreak havoc on the environment. If an old-fashioned plunger won't clear your drain, try this nontoxic formula. Pour 1/2 cup baking soda, 1/2 cup salt, and 1/2 cup vinegar down the drain, in that order. Close the drain until the fizzing stops, then flush with boiling water. Remember to use a drain sieve to trap hair and other objects to help prevent clogging.



**KEDGEREE**

- 3 hard-boiled eggs, chopped
- 2 cups hot, cooked rice
- 2 cups cooked, flaked fish
- 1/2 cup cream
- 2 tablespoons melted butter
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- dash of nutmeg or mace

Mix all ingredients together well in top of a double boiler. Heat carefully over boiling water until heated through. Serve for a traditional breakfast or a light lunch.

Makes 6 to 8 servings




