wings, each with 24 research pens,
and a laboratory.

The pullet building contains 10
floor/battery rooms, a large pullet
cage rearing room, a feed mixing
and storage area, and a laboratory.

The cage layer/market turkey
building contains six floor/battery
rooms, a cage layer room with
3,000-hen capacity, an egg storage
area, an egg analysis and process-
ing center and laboratory, and 24
floor pens for market turkeys.

The breeder building contains a
large cage room for male and
female breeders, observational
floor pens, an egg cooler and a
records laboratory.

The processing building
includes slaughter and evisceration
rooms, a walk-in cooler and freez-
er, a laboratory, a shop and a
garage.

Weaver said the environmental
chambers in the research building
will be especially useful. "We can
alter a chamber's temperature,
relative humidity, ventilation and
light rates to simulate different sea-
sons, housing types and other
environmental factors," he said.
"That would have been impossible
at the old research farm, where
environmental conditions often
depended on what was happening
outside."

center is a tribute to the agricultural community in Pennsylvania.

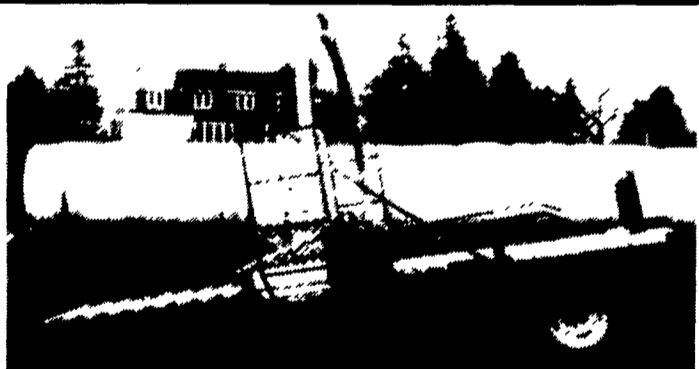
David Morrow, Penn State Board of Trustees, accepted the facility on behalf of the board and brought their greetings. "Poultry is very important to Pennsylvania and very important to Penn State," Morrow said. "Penn State has some of the finest facilities of any land grant university in the U.S.

Weaver said the new facilities more nearly replicate structures and technology used in today's industry. Studies on broilers, turkeys, pullets, layers, breeding and genetics, and processing will be conducted in the center.

The research building contains a conference/classroom, environmental chambers holding up to 400 birds each, a hatcher, a feed mixing area, battery rooms, a surgical suite, a laboratory, offices and student housing.

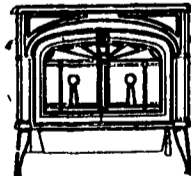
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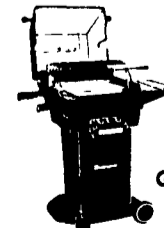
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
