

Importance Of Immunization

A growing number of older people are helping to save young lives and maintain children's health as well as America's wealth.

What they're doing is urging their families and friends with young children to make sure the youngsters are properly immunized, reports the National Committee to Preserve Social Security and Medicare, one of the groups and taking part in the National Immunization Campaign.

Each year, says Martha A. McSteen, National Committee president, millions of American children go unprotected against pertussis, diphtheria, polio and other deadly diseases for which vaccines are available.

In fact, the United States has one of the worst immunization

rates in the Western Hemisphere. We're behind Cuba and Colombia, for example. Here, one in four children have not been fully vaccinated against polio. Nearly half the measles cases reported during the measles epidemic of 1989 occurred among unvaccinated minority children under five years old.

What's more every dollar spent on immunization now saves \$10 in health care costs later. Part of the problem is lack of health care insurance. Not only are approximately eight million children in the United States uninsured entirely, tens of millions more have such inadequate insurance, they are not covered for basic preventive care, including immunizations. Fortunately, community

health centers and public clinics often offer vaccinations at little or no cost.

Vaccinations need to be started before school age. Many people are making sure the children in their lives are protected against:

1. Measles, mumps and rubella with an MMR vaccine.
 2. Polio.
 3. Diphtheria, tetanus (lockjaw) and pertussis (whooping cough) with a DTP shot.
 4. Haemophilus influenza type b (meningitis and other serious infections) with a Hib vaccine.
 5. Hepatitis B (liver infections).

The Sit and Spit and Cherry Pitting Contests will be held in the afternoon.

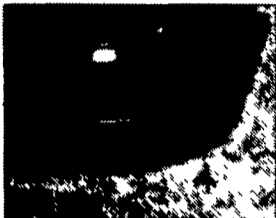
Admission and parking are free. Hours from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Floating lower linkage on all Bush Hog Finishing Mowers allows the implement to ride over objects on the left side independently of the right side, for a closer cut



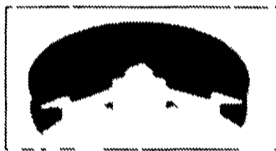
Rounded left front edge of mower directs cut material into air tunnel for fast discharge on the right side. Height of deck provides plenty of space beneath for fine cutting heavy growth



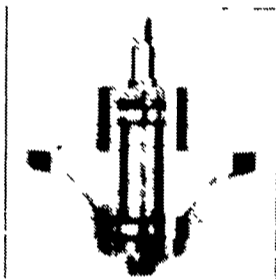
The grass chute on the ATH-900 Mower is spring loaded. This feature lets the chute "float" during operation, preventing damage to the grass when working uneven terrain



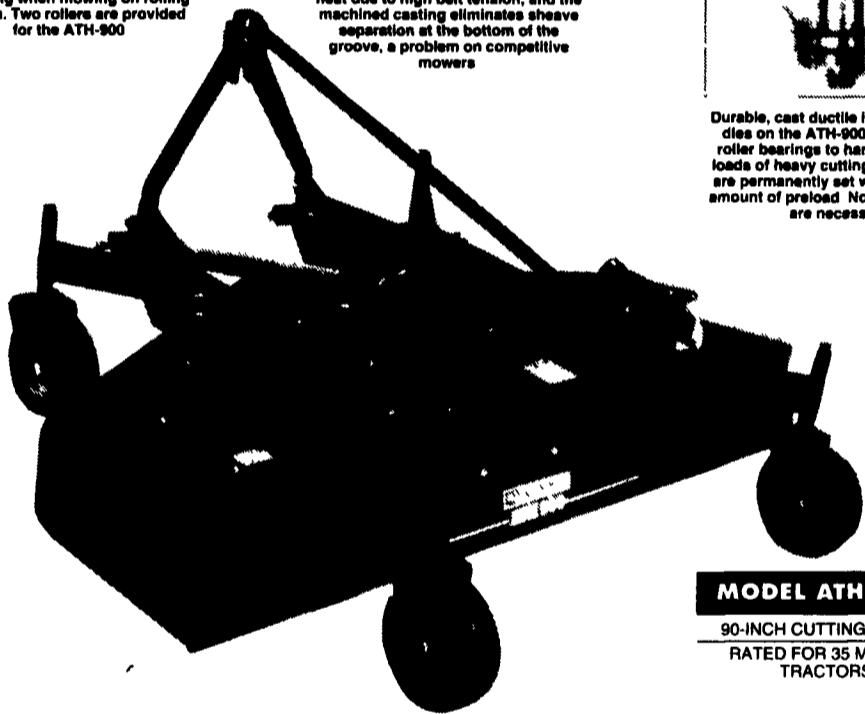
Optional front rollers prevent scalping when mowing on rolling terrain. Two rollers are provided for the ATH-900

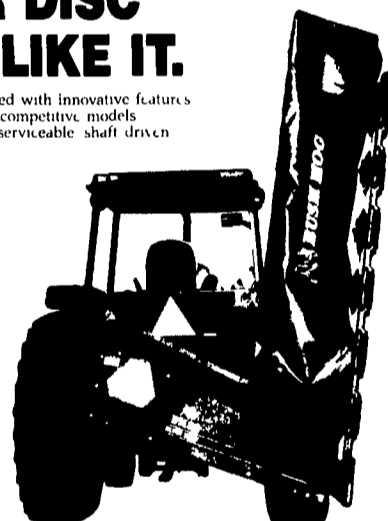
