

### Delmarva Broiler/Fryer Market

Wednesday, May 18, 1994

Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds was light to moderate and best on 3 pound and smaller sizes. Offerings varied from adequate and in fairly good balance to available and slow to clear. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were mostly desirable to heavy. Processing schedules continued heavy. Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 61 to 71 cents. Trade sentiment was steady to weak. In the parts complex, most items were in good balance to closely cleared. The notable exception was boneless skinless breasts which were available and difficult to place at some plants.

SUPPLIES OF EXTRA LARGE WERE SHORT TO INSTANCES ADEQUATE, LARGE WERE BARELY ADEQUATE TO ADEQUATE, AND MEDIUMS WERE GENERALLY ADEQUATE. A EXTRA LARGE .57% -.68, A LARGE .55% -.66, A MEDIUM .48-.56.

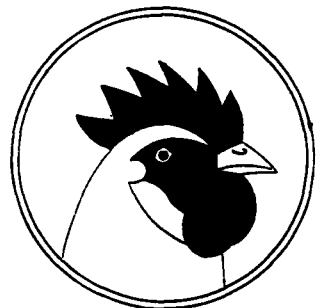
