**WHITSUNTIDE**

Whit Sunday, the seventh Sunday after Easter (known in this country as Pentecost), is the traditional time for baptisms ("Whit" a corruption of "white," refers to the white baptismal garments.) It's also a time of festivals in many European countries. Festivities often continue through the week (known as Whitsuntide) and in many places Whit Monday is a public holiday. Here's an interesting Whit Monday ceremony dating back to 1675. In All Saints Church, St. Ives, England, a bequest providing Bibles for poor children of the parish required winning them at a dice game. Six Bibles are awarded annually, although in recent years the games have been moved from the altar to a "more suitable" place.

**TIP OF THE WEEK**

Before frying or sautéing food, remove from the refrigerator and bring to room temperature.

**EARTHWISE**

With the last frost a hazy memory it's time to store those woolens. You can discourage moths with out resorting to mothballs. Cedar, the traditional alternative is available in all sorts of shapes and sizes (balls, blocks, butterflies) or as an oil. Lavender is a good but mild deterrent. Try mixing it with rosemary, tansy and peppermint to increase effectiveness. Cloves or bay leaves can be scattered among clothing or secured in cheese cloth packets.



**YANKFF COLF SLAW**

- 1 small cabbage, shredded
- 3 sticks celery, chopped
- 1 tablespoon dry mustard
- 1/2 cup vinegar
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 egg beaten
- salt and pepper
- 1 apple, cored and chopped
- 1/2 cup sour cream

Combine cabbage and celery. Mix mustard with 1 tablespoon vinegar. Heat remaining vinegar to boil stir in mustard, sugar, egg salt and pepper. Cook over low heat stirring until thick. Pour hot sauce over cabbage mix well and chill. Stir in apple and sour cream just before serving.

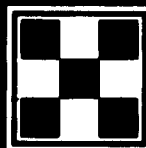
