Movement of ready-to-cook whole birds continued to slow and was no better than moderate at most plants, Offerings were at least adequate and were generally more readily available on 3.5 to 4.0 pound sizes. Live supplies were at least moderate; weights were often heavier than desired. Processing schedules remained very heavy. **Less than trucklot asking prices were unchanged at 60 to 70 cents.** Trade sentiment was about steady. In the parts complex, supplies were at least adequate. Breast items were irregularly distributed with bone-in breasts in closest balance. Wings were adequate for the lighter buying interest. Leg items, particularly leg quar-
