DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED LOWER, WEDNESDAY, ESPECIALLY SOYBEAN PRICES, PRESSURED BY HARVEST PRESSURE, WEATHER CONDITIONS, AND CONTINUED LACK OF SUBSTANTIAL EXPORT SALES. WHEAT UNCHANGED TO 3 CENTS LOWER.

CORN UNCHANGED TO 1 CENT LOWER. SORGHUM 1 TO 3 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 17 TO 20 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT HARVEST IS GOING WELL IN TEXAS AND SPRING WHEAT SEEDING PROGRESSING. CROP ARE LOOKING GOOD. EXPORT DEMAND HAS BEEN VERY SLOW AGAIN THIS WEEK FOR WHEAT BUT POSSIBILITY OF U.S. RENEWING CHINA'S MOST-FAVORED-NATION STATUS LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. CONTINUED PROFIT TAKING IN CORN AND SOYBEAN PITS FORCED PRICES LOWER AGAIN TODAY. MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE IN MID-WEST AREAS WERE ONLY SCATTERED THIS WEEK BUT FORECASTS FOR MORE RAIN ADDED TO LOWER PRICES. EXPORT SALES ARE DOWN THIS WEEK FOR CORN AND BEANS. EXPORT NEWS: JAPAN BOUGHT 19,047 TONNES NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT AND 19,047 TONNES WESTERN WHITE FOR JULY SHIPMENT.
