Soon afterward, I noticed a dark cloud, which was soon followed by thunder. When we started for the other side of the lake, we dis-

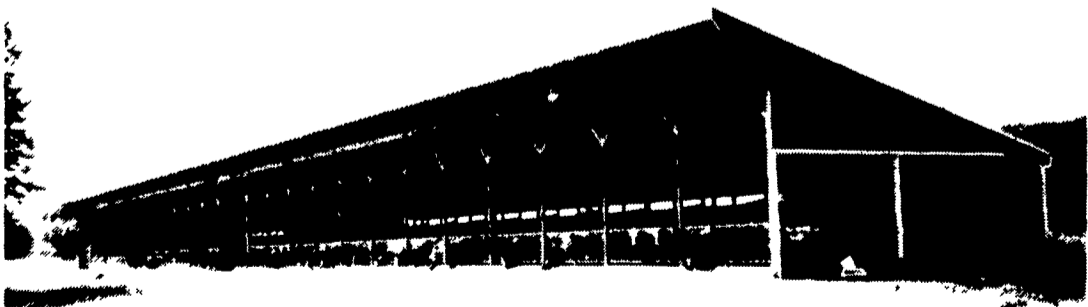
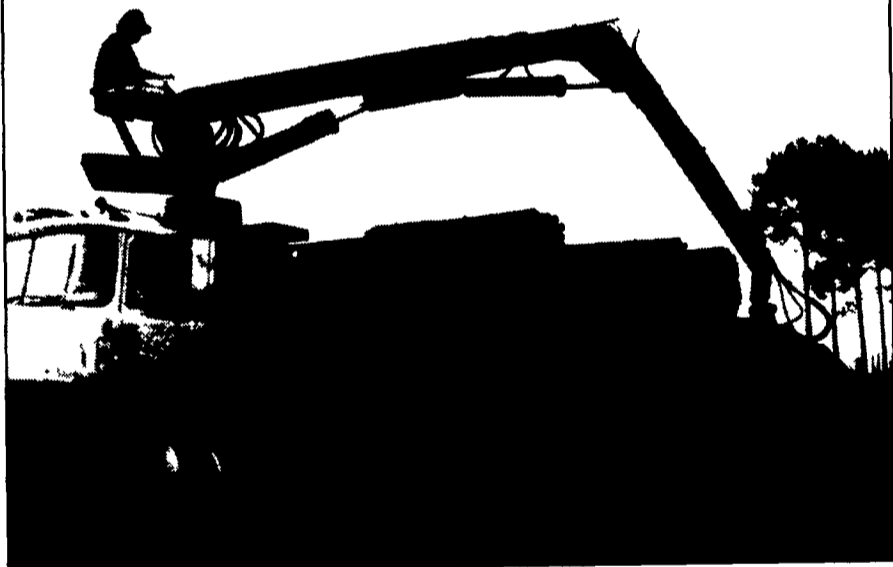
