
WATERCRESS SOUP 4 to 5 potatoes, peeled and diced 4 cups cold water

1 bunch watercress 1 tablespoon butter 1/2 cup milk

salt and pepper to taste

until tender Drain, reserving water Press potatoes through a sieve and return to pot with reserved water. Chop watercress (reserve a few sprigs for garnish), add to pot, and cook 5 minutes Add butter and milk Heat until warm, season to taste, and garnish with watercress Good warm or cold


