

Agricultural Sciences Honors Scholars

NEWARK, Del. — Twelve incoming University of Delaware freshmen have received the highly competitive Agricultural Sciences Scholar awards from the College of Agricultural Sciences.

To be eligible, applicants must be accepted by the university and plan to major in an area of agriculture. They must graduate in the top 20 percent of their high school class and score at least 1050 on the SAT. In addition to outstanding scholastic records, they must also

complete faculty interviews and an essay competition. Scholarships are renewable for four years of study within the college.

NAAB To Hold Dairy Press Tour

COLUMBIA, Mo. — The National Association of Animal Breeders (NAAB), the national trade association for the U.S. artificial insemination (AI) industry for cattle, is co-sponsoring its sixth International Dairy Press Tour on June 11-25.

Journalists from 10 different countries (Australia, Chile, China, Denmark, France, Hungary, Italy, Japan, Mexico and the United Kingdom) will travel across the U.S. to get a first hand look at what the U.S. dairy industry has to offer.

Participants were selected by NAAB from the staff of prominent dairy magazines world-wide. Hosts for the tour are 21st Century Genetics, American Breeders Service, Flatness International, Federated Genetics, Landmark Genetics (California and Wisconsin), NOBA, Select Sires, Sire Power, Spermco, Tri-State Breeders, and World-Wide Sires.

The cross-country tour covers four distinct areas of the U.S. and begins on the east coast in Baltimore, Md. From there, the group will travel to Orlando, Florida, and Madison, Wis., and finish on the west coast in California.

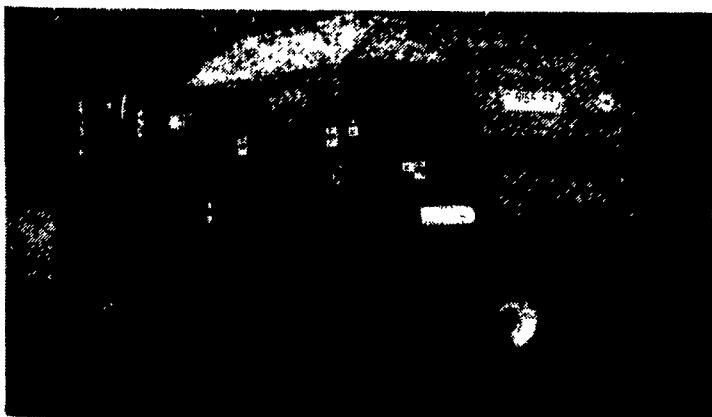
