NATIONAL EGG - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower on mediums in the Midwest, unchanged on the balance. The market tone was cautiously steady to weak. Demand was light to mostly moderate, occasionally better where featured and into food service channels. Supplies were at least adequate or available. Breakers received adequate shell eggs from regular sources, and prices were lower. Live hen markets were generally steady.
