WHEAT 4 TO** 19 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 6 TO 13 **CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 4 TO 7** CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT ENJOYED ANOTHER DAY OF MODERATE EXPORT DEMAND AND IDEAS RUS-SIA AND CHINA MAY TENDER SOON FOR A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNTS OF U.S. WHEAT GAVE AN EXTRA BOOST TO WHEAT PRICES. TRAD-ERS AWAIT USDA'S 1994 WINTER CROP PRODUCTION RE- PORT. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB AS FORECASTERS PRE-DICT THE POSS- IBILITY FOR A HIGH PRESSURE SYSTEM TO SETTLE OVER THE MIDWEST LATE NEXT WEEK. THIS WOULD CAUSE THE **RETURN OF HOT, DRY CONDITIONS** TO BEAN AND CORN CROPS. RECEN-T RAINFALL IN THE CORN BELT AREAS HAVE BEEN VERY BENEFI-CIAL TO NEWLY PLANTED CROPS. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND SUP-PORTED SOYBEAN PRICES.
