DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WEATHER CONTINUED TO BE THE MAJOR SUPPORT TO GRAIN AND SOYBEAN PRICES, WEDNESDAY, ALONG WITH IMPROVED EXPORT INTEREST AND ANTICIPATION OF THURSDAY'S USDA CROP PRODUCTION REPORT. WHEAT 4 TO 19 CENTS HIGHER. CORN 2 TO 5 CENTS HIGHER. SORGHUM 6 TO 13 CENTS HIGHER. SOYBEANS 4 TO 7 CENTS HIGHER. WHEAT ENJOYED ANOTHER DAY OF MODERATE EXPORT DEMAND AND IDEAS RUSIA AND CHINA MAY TENDER SOON FOR A SUBSTANTIAL AMOUNTS OF U.S. WHEAT GAVE AN EXTRA BOOST TO WHEAT PRICES. TRADERS AWAIT USDA'S 1994 WINTER CROP PRODUCTION REPORT. CORN AND SOYBEAN PRICES CONTINUED TO CLIMB AS FORECASTERS PREDICT THE POSSIBILITY FOR A HIGH PRESSURE SYSTEM TO SETTLE OVER THE MIDWEST LATE NEXT WEEK. THIS WOULD CAUSE THE RETURN OF HOT, DRY CONDITIONS TO BEAN AND CORN CROPS. RECENT RAINFALL IN THE CORN BELT AREAS HAVE BEEN VERY BENEFICIAL TO NEWLY PLANTED CROPS. LIGHT EXPORT DEMAND SUPPORTED SOYBEAN PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: THE PHILIPPINES BOUGHT 49,000 TONNES NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT AND 6,000 TONNES WESTERN WHITE UNDER BEP FOR JULY SHIPMENT. JAPAN BOUGHT

42,856 TONNES DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT AND 19,047 TONNES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT. ISRAEL BOUGHT 13,860 TONNES BARLEY UNDER BEP FOR AUGUST/SEPT SHIPMENT. MEXICO BOUGHT 560 TONNES COTTONSEED OIL UNDER (COAP) FOR JULY SHIPMENT. ISRAEL BOUGHT 18,000 TONNES U.S. SOYBEANS FOR JULY SHIPMENT.
