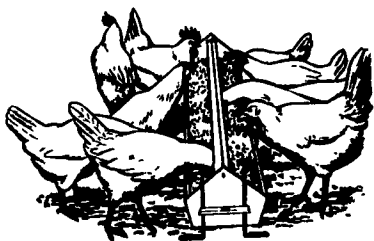

NATIONAL EGG - AT A GLANCE: Prices were unchanged to lower on the large sizes in the North Atlantic and Midwest areas, unchanged elsewhere. The market tone was cautiously steady to weak. Cartoned egg demand was light to moderate, occasionally better. Supplies of all sizes remained adequate to ample, and available. Breakers received adequate shell eggs from regular sources or surplus offerings. Live hen offerings remained at least adequate for the no better than moderate demand, and the trade sentiment was mostly steady.

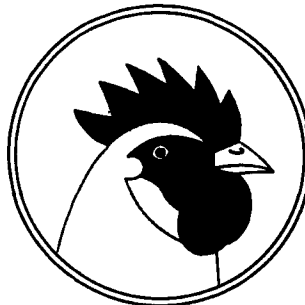
