

The Summer Solstice, the first day of summer in the northern hemisphere, arrives on June 21, at 9:48  $\land$  M, EST, when the Sun reaches the Tropic of Cancer (23½° north latitude) People who live at this latitude (for instance, in the Bahamas) see the Sun directly overhead at noon. The rest of us notice that the Sun is higher in the sky throughout the day. Since the Sun is north of the equator, we also notice that the Sun is up more than half the time. On June 21, Atlanta, Georgia, has 14 hours, 24 minutes of daylight and Boston has 15 hours, 18 minutes,


