OKLAHOMA NATIONAL STOCKYARDS WEEKLY CATTLE SUMMARY: Compared to last Monday: Feeder steers \$1.00 higher; stocker steers and steer calves steady. Feeder heifers over 700 lbs. steady to \$1.00 higher; lighter weights steady. Trade active. Demand good for all classes. Conditions similar to last week with feeders in light to medium flesh and weigh-ups guant to average, modest end full. Quality of supply plain to average, and very attractive. Calves continue to be mostly new crops in medium flesh. Slaughter cows steady to \$1.00 lower; bulls steady to \$1.00 higher. Packer demand improved to moderate. Receipts this week 7,900; last week 9,213; last year 6,428. Supply consisted of 81 percent yearlings and calves over 600 lbs.; 15 percent calves under 600 lbs.; 4 percent cows and bulls. Prices follow with weighted average weight and price in parenthesis.

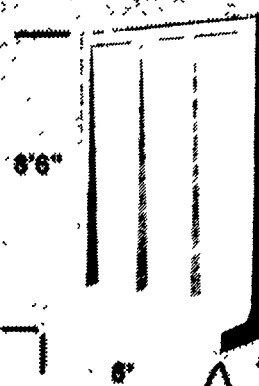
