

Lebanon Conservation District To Select Conservationists Of Year

NORTH CORNWALL (Lebanon Co.) — The Lebanon County Conservation District has announced the start of an industry awards program that would annually recognize the outstanding achievements of local residents as one of three types of

conservationists.

According to a news release made last week by Charles Wertz, county district manager, "Conservation groups have come together for the first time to form an alliance to recognize those who have made

noteworthy contributions in conserving Lebanon County's natural resources."

According to Wertz, representatives of the district, the Lebanon County Federation of Sportsman's Clubs, the Pa. Game Commission, the Pa. Fish and Boat Commission,

the Pa. DER Bureau of Forestry, the USDA Soil Conservation Service, and the group Citizens Coordinating For Clean Water (CCCW), are to present awards to deserving nominees in the categories of: Lebanon County Conservationist of the Year; Lebanon County Conservation Landowner of the Year; and Lebanon County Conservation Educator of the Year.

the Year award will go to an active teacher excelling in environmental education."

In order to make a nomination for any of the three awards, one of three different entry forms, each designed specifically for a different award, must be completed and submitted to the district by August 31.

The entries then will be judged by an alternating committee representing the five different county conservation organizations. Winners of each award will be invited to the annual meeting/luncheon of the Lebanon County Conservation District on Nov. 3.

Wednesday, June 29 — Orchard Fruit - Diseases And Insect Pests. Learn how to control insect and disease problems in your home orchard through vari-

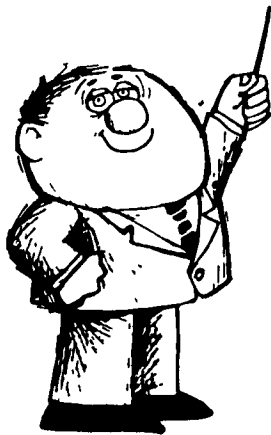
ous techniques including trapping, monitoring, biological, chemical and organic controls.

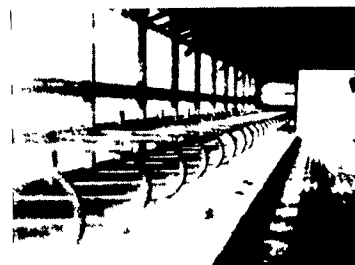

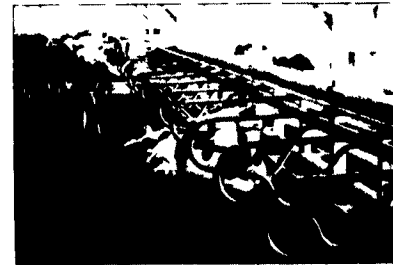
