DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES CONTINUE LOWER UNDER HARVEST PRESSURE AND PROFIT TAKING, DESPITE EXCELLENT EXPORT DEMAND AND RAIN DELAYED HARVEST IN PARTS OF KANSAS. THE WET WEATHER ACROSS THE MIDWEST AND CORN BELT AREAS WASHED CORN AND BEAN PRICES LOWER. WHEAT 5 TO 9 CENTS LOWER. CORN 5 TO 8 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 11 TO 12 CENTS LOWER. SOYBEANS 9 TO 14 CENTS LOWER. WHEAT HARVEST CONTINUED TO PROGRESS INTO KANSAS WITH AROUND 25 PERCENT CUTTING COMPLETE. RAINFALL CAUSED SOME DELAYS IN CUTTING BUT NOT ENOUGH TO SUPPORT PRICES. EXCELLENT EXPORT DEMAND FOR WHEAT LIMITED PRICE DECLINES. CORN AND BEAN CROPS FLOURISH DUE TO MUCH NEEDED MOISTURE RECEIVED IN MID-WEST AND CORN BELT AREAS WITH ADDITIONAL RAINS AND COOLER TEMPERATURES FORECAST INTO NEXT WEEK. HEAVY FUND SELLING ON THE BOARD MAGNIFIED SOYBEAN PRICE WEAKNESS. THE LACK OF MUCH EXPORT DEMAND ALSO ADDED PRESSURE TO PRICES.

EXPORT NEWS: ALGERIA BOUGHT 75,000 TONNES HARD RED WINTER WHEAT AND 25,000 TONNES SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT UNDER EEP FOR AUGUST. PAKISTAN BOUGHT 250,000 TONNES SOFT WHITE WHEAT UNDER EEP FOR OCTOBER SHIPMENT. SUBSAHARAN BOUGHT 25,000 TONNES OF NORTHERN/DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT UNDER EEP FOR JUNE/OCTOBER SHIPMENT. JAPAN BOUGHT 23,809 TONNES DARK NORTHERN SPRING WHEAT, 10,000 TONNES WESTERN WHITE, 28,094 HARD RED WINTER, UNDER EEP FOR AUGUST SHIPMENT. ALGERIA BOUGHT 73,500 TONNES BARLEY UNDER EEP FOR JULY SHIPMENT. CYPRUS BOUGHT 25,000 TONNES BARLEY UNDER EEP FOR AUG/SEP SHIPMENT.
