Retail demand continued mostly light to fair, and food service movement was fair to good. Supplies were generally at least adequate or available, except the heaviest sizes were less available where production of the heavy eggs was diminished from the hot, humid weather. Breaking stock prices were unchanged, and supplies were at least adequate for the unaggressive demand. Live hen offerings were adequate to ample for the light and unaggressive domand, and the undertone was about steady.
