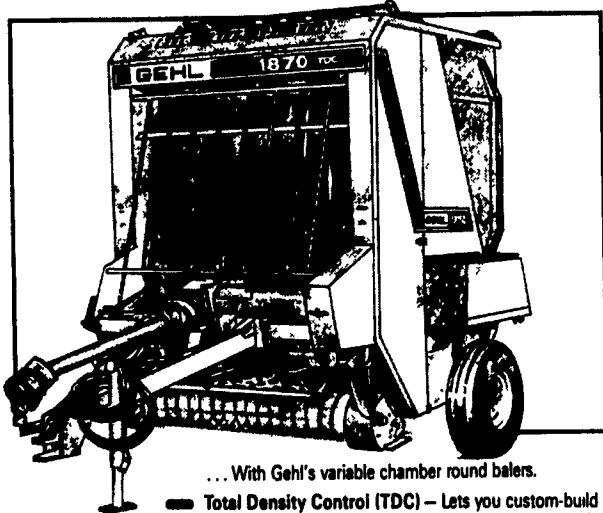
The property of 19.25 acres with a house and a barn zoned R-40,000 was sold for \$330,000.

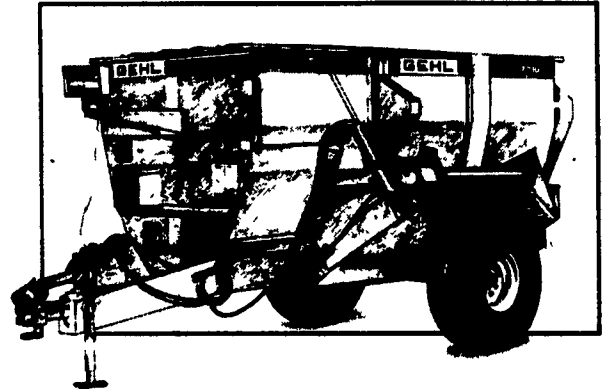
