At 11:30 a.m., judging will

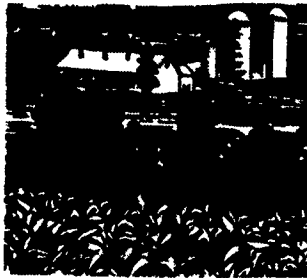

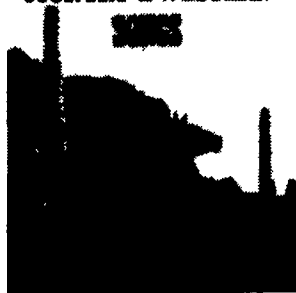
