DAILY NATIONAL GRAIN SUMMARY WHEAT PRICES ARE MIXED WEDNESDAY, WITH ON GOING HARVEST ADDING PRES-SURE AND MUCH IMPROVED EXPORT DEMAND UNDERPINNING PRICES. CORN AND BEAN PRICES PLUM- METED IN REACTION TO **REVISED WEATHER FORECASTS** FOR NEXT WEEK IN MIDWEST AREAS. WHEAT MIXED. CORN 9 TO 12 CENTS LOWER. SORGHUM 17 TO 25 CENTS LOWER. SOY- BEANS 20 TO 22 CENTS LOWER. ACTIVE HARVEST AND REPORTED GOOD YIELDS ERASED SOME OF YESTERDAY'S PRICE SUPPORT. THE SOFT RED WINTER WHEAT HARVEST IS NEAR-LY COMPLETE IN THE SOUTHEAST AND DELTA STATES WHERE RECORD QUALITY YIELDS HAVE BEEN REPORTED. HARD RED WINT-ER COMBINING HAS MOVED NORTHWARD INTO IOWA WITH

WHEAT EXPORT SALES POURED IN TODAY AND HELPED TO SUSTAIN SOME OF TUESDAY'S GAINS WITH TAIWAN AND JAPAN MAJOR BUY-ERS. CORN AND BEAN PRICES HAVE BEEN AS CHANGEABLE AS THE WEATHER LATELY. A COOL- ER THAN EXPECTED HOT FRONT HAS BEEN FORECAST FOR MIDWEST AREAS NEXT WEEK AND SOME FEARS OF CROP DAMAGE HAVE EASED. CORN IS ENTERING THE CRITICAL SILKING STAGE AND MOISTURE AND COOLER TEMPERA-TURES ARE VERY IMPORTANT TO THE PROCESS. HEAVY PROFIT TAK-ING ON THE BOARD ALSO UNDER-MINED BEAN PRICES AS MILD WEATHER PROMOTES POTENTIAL FOR GOOD YIELDS.
